#### What's In the Donations?

Good question. Lots of lovely books and media. Some not so lovely. However, once in a while, something very personal/special comes into the FOL collections. A school picture, a pamphlet from a long-ago family reunion, a small book from a 1916 baptism with the certificate included and most recently a cub scout book from the mid-1950s which had been personalized by the owner to include pictures and newspaper articles about ceremonies where he and his friends received awards. There is usually no way to tell which donation contained the item or who the donor was, but we like to try to return the treasure to family or a library or historical society in the location where it originated.

First, we look over the item to find names, locations, time frame. Sometimes the owner has helpfully written some of these useful clues on the item. Other times the item is imprinted with information like a photography studio, or publication date/place. Using the available information in this time of the internet, Ancestry, Family Search, Google, Facebook, and other databases can sometimes solve the mystery. In the case of the cub scout book, we found the owner and returned it to him. This week we received a very nice thank you.
